

Course Description

This symposium will provide pediatricians, PNP's, ER providers, psychologists, social workers, and other pediatric health care professionals with the most current information about the management of common childhood hematologic and oncologic problems that may affect their young patients. Although there are some hematologic conditions that pediatricians and PNP's may treat as part of their primary care practice, children may present with more complicated symptoms that require the involvement or consultation of pediatric specialists. In addition, children who present to their primary care providers during and after the conclusion of treatment for malignancies will have health care needs that are different from their peers. Transition of care from hematology and oncology specialists to pediatric primary care providers needs to be well-coordinated and streamlined. It is essential for providers to use the Care Compact model that focuses on the patient's goals for health to collaborate and address the unique needs of pediatric hematology and oncology patients and their families. Attendance at the symposium will offer participants an opportunity to update their knowledge regarding the management of their pediatric patients with common hematologic and oncologic diagnoses, as well as the care of childhood cancer survivors.

Learning Objectives

1. Evaluate common hematologic problems in pediatric patients
2. Discuss current diagnostic and treatment guidelines when children present with hematology/oncology symptoms


